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DIAGNOSTIC INJECTIONS AND PAIN MANAGEMENT

Injections and pain management procedures are used to diagnose and/or treat pain in the spine (lumbar, thoracic and cervical) as well as joints (shoulder, hip and wrist). An MRI or CT exam may be done with these procedures.

Our goal is to make your experience as comfortable as possible during your procedure. You will be awake so you can interact with the radiologist and provide feedback to help pinpoint the source of your pain.

The majority of diagnostic injection and pain management procedures are performed in our centers. In some cases, your procedure may be performed at our St. Louis Park or Woodbury ambulatory surgery centers.

EXAM PREPARATION

- We will contact you prior to your appointment to review your medical history, including allergies and current medications (especially pain medications and blood thinners)
- If you are on blood thinner medication, you must stop taking the medication 3-5 days before your procedure. Talk to your provider before stopping any medications
- Bring previous imaging reports, films, and/or exam results (MRI, CT, X-rays) if available
- You will need a driver for your appointment (exception: extremity arthrograms, such as shoulder, hip and knee joints). If you are unable to drive or arrange transportation, call us for assistance
- You will be asked to change into scrubs or a gown and given a locker to store your clothes, and anything else you may have with you during your exam
- We recommend that you continue to drink liquids and/or have a light meal up until 1-2 hours before your injection. If you are receiving sedation, you will be asked to not eat or drink anything 4 hours before your procedure
- Notify us if you are pregnant or breastfeeding

SPINAL INJECTIONS

EPIDURAL STEROID INJECTION/ EPIDUROGRAPHY, FACET JOINT/ NERVE INJECTION, NERVE ROOT BLOCK

These procedures are performed to pinpoint the cause of your pain and help reduce symptoms by decreasing inflammation and swelling that may be present.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING YOUR PROCEDURE

- Using a thin needle and X-ray for guidance, a radiologist will inject contrast (X-ray dye) into or near the structure thought to be causing your pain
- To ensure correct placement of the needle for the injection, X-rays are taken. A combination of an antiinflammatory (steroid) and anesthetic (numbing) medications are injected for pain relief
- You will remain awake during the 10-20 minute procedure, and may experience some slight pressure or discomfort during the injection
- Inform the radiologist how your pain differs from your usual symptoms
- You will be asked to wait 30-40 minutes for observation after your procedure before leaving

RECOVERY FOR EPIDURAL STEROID INJECTION/ EPIDUROGRAPHY, FACET JOINT/NERVE INJECTION, NERVE ROOT BLOCK

Every patient is different, but typically you can expect:

- Numbness may occur 4-6 hours post-procedure
- Your usual symptoms may return the night of the procedure and may even be more severe than usual for an additional day or two
- The benefits of the steroids may require 2-3 days to take effect, but they may take as long as 5-7 days
- Keep track of how long your relief lasts and report it to your provider. If there is no change in the pain, then investigation can be focused on other possible sources of pain. In either case, the information is useful to the provider who referred you for this procedure
- Facial flushing (redness), occasional low-grade fevers of 99.5°F or less, hiccups, insomnia, headaches, increased heart rate, water retention, increased appetite, abdominal cramping and/or bloated feeling are possible side effects of the steroid medications. These symptoms will go away within 3-4 days after the injection. If these symptoms do not resolve in 4 days, contact your provider



DISCOGRAM INJECTIONS

Discogram injections are diagnostic procedures that are performed to get additional information about the cause of your pain and help determine the appropriate treatment needed. This study is generally performed on patients considering spinal fusion surgery. In some cases, discograms are also therapeutic, providing relief from your pain by injecting steroid (anti-inflammatory) and anesthetic (numbing) medication into the disc(s) to reduce inflammation.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING YOUR PROCEDURE

- You will lie on your stomach for lumbar and thoracic procedures and on your back for cervical procedures
- Using X-ray for guidance, a radiologist will place a thin needle into the center of your disc(s) thought to be causing your pain
- Contrast is injected and X-rays are taken
- You will remain awake during your procedure, which takes approximately 15-40 minutes
- During and immediately following the procedure, you will be asked to describe what you are feeling (i.e., does it reproduce your symptoms)
- In select cases, a CT exam will follow

RECOVERY FOR DISCOGRAM INJECTIONS

- Some degree of discomfort during and after this procedure is expected
- Limit your "stress-bearing" or "strenuous" activities for 24 hours due to expected postprocedure discomfort
- We recommend taking the following day off of work, but the decision to return to work is at your discretion
- A prescription for post-procedural pain medication is available for patients who require it

MYELOGRAMS

A myelogram is a procedure performed on the spinal cord and/or nerves. They are usually done to evaluate for disc herniation, stenosis, bone spurs or arachnoiditis. Contrast (X-ray dye) is injected into the spinal canal and X-rays are taken.

PREPARATION FOR YOUR PROCEDURE

In addition to the instructions indicated in the "exam preparation" section on page 5, drink plenty of fluids (water and juices, not soda) one day prior to, the day of and the day after your procedure. This will help you eliminate the contrast from your body.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING YOUR PROCEDURE

- Using X-ray for guidance, a radiologist will insert a thin needle into the spinal canal in your low back
- You will be lying on a table, which may be tilted to allow the contrast to disperse
- Once the contrast has been injected, the needle is removed and X-rays are taken
- You will remain awake during your procedure, which takes approximately 15-20 minutes
- You may experience mild discomfort during your procedure
- In most cases, immediately following completion of the myelogram a CT scan will be performed, which will take an additional 30 minutes

RECOVERY FOR MYELOGRAMS

Follow these instructions for 24 hours after your procedure.

- You will need someone to drive you home. We recommend that you lay down in the vehicle or recline the front seat
- Headaches are a possible side effect of this procedure. To decrease your chance of developing a headache, lie on your back, side or stomach with your head elevated no more than 30 degrees (about two pillows) until bedtime. You may also elevate your feet for comfort
- You may walk to the bathroom and sit up to eat; however, activities requiring you to sit or stand should be kept to a minimum. Do not remain upright for more than 5 minutes at a time, and do not get up more than two to three times per hour
- Drink plenty of fluids (water and juices are preferred, but a small amount of caffeinated liquid is also beneficial) to help clear the contrast solution from your system. The contrast agent will be absorbed into your body and excreted through the urine as a clear substance within 24 hours.
 Avoid drinking alcoholic beverages for at least 24 hours after the myelogram

If you develop headaches, nausea or dizziness, which are worse with sitting, standing or walking, continue the instructions as indicated above for an additional 24 hours. If you do not receive relief after 48 hours, contact RAYUS.

RADIOFREQUENCY RHIZOTOMY

Radiofrequency (RF) rhizotomy or neurotomy is a procedure designed to decrease and/or eliminate pain symptoms arising from arthritis of joints in the back and neck. The procedure involves destroying the nerves causing the pain with highly localized heat generated with radiofrequency. By destroying these nerves, the communication link which signals pain from the spine to the brain is broken. Before this procedure is ordered, tests are performed to confirm which nerve should be targeted.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE PROCEDURE

- Using X-ray guidance, the specialized radiologist will insert a thin needle directly on top of the facet nerve
- To verify the needle position, the nerve may be stimulated using low voltage electricity. The stimulation will cause the affected muscles to rhythmically contract
- The radiologist will then use numbing medication (anesthetic) to desensitize the nerve
- Finally, the radiologist will apply heat to the nerve via the electrode. This heat is designed to create a lesion, causing the nerve to become cauterized or burnt, which breaks the communication link to the brain

RECOVERY FOR

RADIOFREQUENCY RHIZOTOMY

- A nurse will review guidelines you will be asked to follow post-procedure (pertaining to driving and drinking alcoholic beverages) if you were sedated during your procedure
- You may experience numbness and/or relief from symptoms after the procedure due to the anesthetic
- Once the local anesthetic effects have worn off, your usual symptoms may return and may be more severe for up to 5-7 days after the procedure
- You may be asked to keep a record of symptoms following the procedure and report to the referring provider at your follow-up appointment
- When the procedure is successful, improvement is usually noticed 2-3 weeks after the procedure. However, it may take up to 4 weeks before symptoms improve and the beneficial effects of the rhizotomy are realized. Every patient is different and your outcome may vary



SACROILIAC (SI) JOINT INJECTIONS

A sacroiliac joint injection is a procedure used to identify and treat painful joints. Once the sacroiliac joints become painful, they may cause pain in the low back, buttocks, abdomen, groin and/or legs.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE PROCEDURE

- In some cases, the radiologist will numb a small area of skin with numbing medicine
- If numbed, once the medicine has taken effect, the radiologist directs a very small needle, using X-ray guidance, into the joint
- A small amount of contrast (dye) is injected to ensure proper needle position inside the joint space
- Then, a small mixture of numbing medicine (anesthetic) and anti-inflammatory (steroid) medication is injected. One or both joints may be injected depending on the location of your usual pain

RECOVERY FOR SI JOINT INJECTIONS

- After the procedure, you will walk around and try to imitate something that would normally bring about your usual pain
- You may be asked to report the percentage of pain relief and record the relief experienced during the next week
- You will need a driver for your appointment. If you are unable to drive or arrange transportation, call us for assistance

MUSCULOSKELETAL INJECTIONS

ARTHROGRAPHY

Arthrography is an imaging study designed to diagnose problems within a joint (i.e., shoulder, hip, wrist) and sometimes to provide pain relief. Contrast (X-ray dye) is placed into the joint to better visualize your joint and any present abnormalities in X-ray or CT scans

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE PROCEDURE

- Using X-ray guidance, a radiologist will place a thin needle into the joint and inject contrast (X-ray dye)
- You may experience some slight pressure or discomfort
- X-rays or a CT exam will then be obtained to help the doctor make a diagnosis
- This procedure takes approximately 20 minutes
- Depending on the test ordered by your provider, an anesthetic (numbing medicine) and/or steroid (anti-inflammatory) may be injected into the joint to provide pain relief

RECOVERY FOR ARTHROGRAPHY

- You may experience some soreness at the injection site for up to 24 hours after your procedure
- Regular activities may be resumed immediately after your procedure, however, limit strenuous activities on the affected joint for 24 hours

MRI ARTHROGRAPHY

MRI arthrography is an imaging study designed to diagnose problems within a joint (i.e., shoulder, hip and wrist). A contrast agent called gadolinium is placed into the area being studied followed by an MRI exam. Contrast is used to better visualize your joint and any abnormalities.

WHAT TO EXPECT DURING THE PROCEDURE

- Using X-ray guidance, a radiologist will place a thin needle into the joint and inject contrast (gadolinium)
- You may experience some slight pressure or discomfort
- X-rays will then be taken. This portion of your procedure takes approximately 20 minutes
- You will then have an MRI exam
- MRI is one of the safest and most advanced imaging techniques available
- The procedure uses a strong magnetic field and high-frequency radio waves to create detailed pictures of the body
- Because of the MRI's magnetic field, you must remove any metallic objects, such as jewelry, watches, hairpins or barrettes
- Inform the technologist of prior surgeries or metal implants, such as pacemakers or aneurysm clips
- The average length of an MRI is 30 minutes
- You may bring your favorite CD to play or listen to your favorite radio station during your exam

RECOVERY FOR MRI ARTHROGRAPHY

- You may experience some soreness at the injection site for up to 24 hours after your procedure
- Regular activities may be resumed immediately after your procedure, however, limit strenuous or "stress-bearing" activities on the affected joint for 24 hours

When you arrive for your appointment we will ask you to verify registration and provide health information related to your procedure. We may call to assist you with registration prior to your appointment. Our centers are conveniently located (directions are located in the back of the brochure) and free parking is provided outside of our buildings.
